- ★ Cite one particularly significant event that occurred during his presidency and his role, if any, in that event.
- ★ Name an influential member of his Cabinet who either displayed brilliance within the administration or went on to greatness in another capacity.
- ★ Briefly describe the work of one memorable American, outside the general realm of politics, who lived during the same era.

- ❷ Gutzon Borglum had considered including a giant entablature on his Mount Rushmore masterpiece. The following dates, with relevant text, were to have been etched to the viewer's right of Abraham Lincoln. Choose any three of these dates and cite what you think is the most important event in United States history to occur during each of those years. Provide a brief description of the event and why it is so memorable. Be sure to state who was President at the time and what part, if any, he played in the event. Finally, identify a year and accompanying event that might be given serious consideration to be added since 1904.

- ❷ Pick any one of the Presidents atop Mount Rushmore and discuss the legitimacy of the memorable title history has bestowed upon him.

  - ★ Thomas Jefferson → “Sage of Monticello”
  - ★ Theodore Roosevelt → “Trust-Buster”
